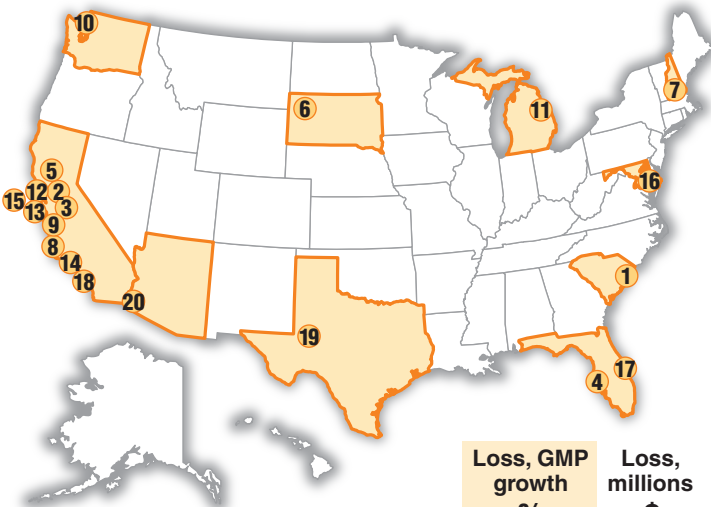


Housing crisis hits metro areas
